



Call for Applications for Instructor Position:

Columbus State University's Department of Communication invites applications for a full-time, 9-month, temporary instructor position in Public Relations. The position is a one-year appointment holding a tenure-track line open for a search conducted during the 2017-18 academic year. The individual hired for the temporary position is encourage to apply for the position, as the qualifications for the tenure-track position will mirror the temporary position.

Position Description:

We offer classes in three modalities (face-to-face, online, hybrid). Instructors teach a 4:4 load, and designate preferences for both modality and specific courses. The selected candidate will be expected to teach courses that support our curriculum, including but not limited to: advertising campaigns, public relations principles, public relations management, public relations campaigns, social/digital media, strategic media writing, and digital media production. The successful candidate will maintain a 4:4 teaching load per semester. Summer teaching is often available. In addition, the successful candidate will be responsible for supporting our student organizations and supporting our Non-Profit and Civic Engagement Center. This position is available August 2017.
