Valdosta State University's College of the Arts seeks applications for **Lecturer of Communication Arts, Communication Technology**. This is an academic, non-tenure track faculty position in the Communication Arts Department scheduled to begin August 1, 2019. To carry out our comprehensive mission, we seek applicants with the desire and ability to successfully engage students as they launch and progress through their intellectual journey.

Responsibilities include teaching courses in technology-related courses in public relations, application of social media, graphic, and digital media design. Other teaching assignments possible based on qualifications and experience. Courses may be delivered in traditional, online, hybrid, and in off-campus formats. Faculty members are expected to make substantive contributions to the Department including departmental, university and community service.

Minimum required qualifications:

- Master's degree in Communication closely related field.
- Demonstrated commitment to excellence in teaching and learning, as well as scholarship;
- Commitment to diversity and inclusion.

Preferred qualifications:

- Professional relations, design, and college-level teaching experience.

The Department of Communication Arts at Valdosta State University is a diverse, multidisciplinary department offering five undergraduate majors and five minor programs, undergraduate certificates, and a graduate program, including; Communication (Interpersonal, Organizational, and Public Relations), Dance, Emergent Media and Communication (fully online), Mass Media with additional Broadcast Journalism and Sports Broadcasting certificates, and Theatre (Production, Performance Management, Technical Theatre, and Musical Theatre). The College of the Arts is also home to the award-winning Valdosta Symphony Orchestra and the Peach State Summer Theatre, designated as the Official Musical Theatre of the State of Georgia.
