- **II.** Call to order and welcome
 - **a.** Scott called the meeting to order at 4:24pm CT.
- III. Reading and approval of the minutes
 - a. Colleen made a motion to approve the minutes
 - b. Katy seconded
 - c. Approved -7/0/0
- IV. Reports of the officers
 - a. Chair: Scott Christen, Tennessee Tech University
 - i. NCA
 - 1. Budget
 - a. NCA is still in the red
 - b. Continues to operate in the red
 - 2. Planning
 - a. NCA does not have a conference planned out after the next three years
 - b. That may be a hint at something but no one knows for sure
 - 3. Scandal
 - a. Someone who was invited to perform at the President's Meeting at NCA was told they could not perform their piece about Palestine
 - b. It started a protest at the NCA convention
 - ii. Executive Council Report
 - 1. Business Meetings
 - a. Business meetings being stacked on top of each other, as was the case at this convention, isn't effective

- because it inhibits them from attending meetings they may otherwise go to.
- b. SSCA is going to try to scatter them throughout the program.
- c. Considering them going virtual
- d. We need more representation and diversity who are willing to serve on the IDD board.
 - i. Colleen echoed Scott's thoughts and advocated for bringing in more people.
 - ii. Elizabeth acknowledged seeing the same people rotating through positions.

2. Approvals

- a. Strategic communication and marketing position
 - i. Exploring ways to fund those positions
 - ii. Fundraising for those positions and may be its own position
 - iii. Approved a one-year time range for these two positions overseen by John Haas
 - iv. Evaluating hiring someone to manage all four of the regional websites
- b. Approved an African American Communication Division

iii. SSCA

- 1. Numbers go down when the location isn't appealing
- 2. Lifetime members are not attending
- 3. Locations for the next three years:
 - a. Birmingham
 - b. Mobile
 - c. Our 4 years out isn't planned yet, but potential locations include:
 - i. Little Rock, Arkansas
 - ii. Houston, Texas
 - iii. Memphis, Tennessee

4. Anchor locations:

- a. Central location we continue to go back to
- b. Will help keep costs low
- c. Potential anchor location: Birmingham
- d. Scott argued that the anchor location doesn't have to be central but should be based on the appeal factor.
 - i. Colleen echoed Scott

- ii. Colleen advocated for a place with an international airport
- e. There will be survey sent out so please fill that out.
- 5. People did cancel at the last minute
- 6. Cup promotion increased our Caring Connections which are donations that go directly into SSCA
- 7. SSCA's budget is good
 - a. We went over budget for this convention by about \$1000
 - b. We had room in our budget to cover the extra \$1000.
 - c. Our budget doesn't include the money we bring in from
- iv. Katherine Grace Hendrix Award
 - 1. Approved last year
 - 2. For instructional research about marginalized populations
 - 3. Has become a fully funded award at the SSCA Exec level
 - 4. First Awardee: Adam Key
 - a. Title: "Sounds about White: Critiquing NCA Standards for Public Speaking Competency"
 - b. Katherine Grace Hendrix was his mentor.
 - c. Winning the award meant a lot to him.
 - d. Elizabeth advocated for Adam and his research and why he was nominated (outside being Katherine Grace Hendrix's mentee)
 - e. Will maintain our own standards for this award
- b. Vice Chair: Jacob Metz, Tennessee Tech University
 - i. 24 Submissions
 - 1. 9 papers
 - 2. 15 panels
 - 3. 21 accepted | 87.5% acceptance rate
 - ii. New System
 - 1. Much easier than last year
 - 2. Still some kinks but the communication and organization is so much better
 - 3. Elizabeth echoed the same sentiments
- c. Vice Chair Elect: Colleen Mestayer, Tennessee Tech University
 - i. SSCA 2025
 - 1. Theme: Anchors and Anchoring Communication
 - a. How does communication anchor us?
 - b. What things shouldn't anchor us?
 - c. Having some panels outside of the norm

- i. Walking tour panel
- ii. Aesthetic panels (e.g., music panels, art panels)
- iii. The Ethnography Division held a writing workshop panel
- d. Encourage poster submissions
 - i. Scott echoed the poster idea.
 - ii. He really likes that idea.
- e. We can add things to our call like accepting extended abstracts
 - i. Scott said we cannot do extended abstracts because in our by-laws says submissions must be full panels.
 - ii. If our by-laws doesn't preclude us from accepting those types of submissions, then we can.
 - iii. Lakelyn asked if we could amend the by-laws
- f. Reach out to membership
 - i. Elizabeth asked if we have created a Google form or something to solicit ideas from the membership
 - ii. Scott affirmed the idea and mentioned it would be discussed later in the meeting.

- b. Elizabeth
 - i. Anchors are big and heavy and meant to keep us safe.
 - ii. Anchors don't always work
 - iii. Colleen: So maybe instructors as anchors
 - iv. Anchors of instruction
 - v. Anchors in walls make the infrastructure stronger
 - vi. Thinking about how what we do strengthens: 1.) Our students, 2.) Our community, 3.) Our scholarship, etc.

c. Scott:

- i. Anchors not just as ships but also for balloons.
- ii. Anchoring communication to bring in and increase enrollment and retention.
- iii. The ways communication is a fundamental anchor for keeping students involved.
- iv. Strengthening our skills
- v. Anchoring communication in students' skill sets
- vi. Instructional communication is an anchor to the field
- vii. Our field doesn't go anywhere if we aren't doing those instructional behaviors
- viii. Specific theories that anchor communication
- ix. Invite an author who is well-known to cover foundational theories (Ex. Stephanie Kelly to create a panel about immediacy)

d. Ryan:

i. Anchoring as being stopped or not drifting away

ii. Making sure you don't drift away from the anchor point

e. Lakelyn

- i. What about foundational theories that shouldn't anchor our discipline/field?
- ii. How do we anchor alternative communication theories (e.g., by non-White authors, about non-White populations) as foundational to the field/discipline?

i. Fundamental communication behaviors that anchor interpersonal relationships?
