  - A. Chair Erin Basinger
    - 1. Executive Committee Updates
      - a) 2029 SSCA location is Charlotte, NC
      - b) \$10,000 stipend for the executive director is approved. This should not affect finances for SCCA
      - c) NCA budget has \$10 million, running a \$1 million deficit each year
      - d) DEI is part of the discussion for funding
  - B. Vice Chair & Convention Report Erin Basinger
    - 1. 20 submissions this year (9 papers, 10 posters, 1 submitted panel)
    - 2. 93% acceptance rate for papers, 100% for papers, 93% overall
    - 3. Each submission had 2 reviewers other than 3 papers for which only 1 review was submitted. Aloia weighed in on those.
    - 4. Given 11 slots, but only used 8 slots
    - 5. Proposed 8 panels total (4 for papers, 4 panels)

- 6. Proposed to host a poster session as the IPC division because the division had enough posters to host, but there were only 2 other poster submissions for the conference (from 2 other divisions)
- Co-sponsored Quiz Bowl with Communication Theory and Methodology and Health Communication
  - a) Interpersonal Communication Division beat Communication
     Theory and Methodology and Health Communication Division
- 8. Top papers each had one additional reviewer.
- 9. Thanks to our 11 reviewers for their service.
- 10. Strategies for recruitment
  - a) Co-sponsoring with other divisions
  - b) Erin reached out to programs with graduate programs in VA, NC, and SC (special emphasis on non-R1 programs)
  - c) Poster sessions were a success, but it may have minimized full paper submissions.
  - d) Shout out to David Roaché and Christopher Newport University for the number of submissions from undergraduates and faculty.
  - e) Encourage submission of more panels in the future (e.g., roundtable discussion). Panels are well-attended, and attendees enjoy them
  - f) Erin opened the floor for increasing submissions/attendance:
    - (1) Equal benefit for full paper and extended abstract for posters (Jenny Crowley)
    - (2) Can the poster submission deadline be moved after the full paper deadline (Leah LeFebvre)? Kelly Brisini will contact SSCA 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President to determine if this is feasible.
    - (3) Suggestion to have a graduate student networking fair integrated with the book fair (Kelly Morrison)
    - (4) Solicit abstracts to determine whether submitters would be open to be paneled or postered (Jenny Crowley)
    - (5) Distinction that extended abstracts are exempt from top paper awards
    - (6) Is there a rule about online presentations for faculty/students who do not have funding to travel to more than one conference? (Quenten Bernhold)
  - g) In 2023, the executive council rejected the idea to move business meetings online (Laura Miller)
